ACEI-HK&M President Report(July 1, 2007 – June 30, 2008) Michael Kam

1. Pear River Delta (PRD) Exchange Project (phase 3), November 2007 to July 2008

ACEI-HKM has been awarded the 2007/08 Education Exchange Fund by the Education Bureau (EDB) in collaboration with Hong Kong Teacher Centre (HKTC) to conduct a project in Hong Kong, Macao and Guangdong Province, China. This is the third time our Association has received the award. The theme of the exchange project is on *Project learning* (research-based learning) — practice and sharing. Learned that the curriculum reform currently implemented in Northern Guangdong has attained tremendous success, visits to schools and sharing with students and frontline teachers were arranged. Visits had been arranged to 3 elementary and secondary schools in Shaoguan of Northern Guangdong, 1 school in Zhuhai (a city of Southern Guangdong) and 2 schools in Macao. The highlight of the project was the reciprocal visit by the teachers and educational administration of Guangdong Province, Zhuhai, Shenzhen, and Macao to Hong Kong and delivered talks in the education symposium at the Hong Kong Teacher Centre in June 2008.

2. Education Seminar on Project Learning, 7 June 2008

A seminar sponsored by the ACEI-HKM and Hong Kong Teacher Centre was organized with 50 participants. Speakers were teachers and education officials from Guangzhou, Zhuhai, Shenzhen, Macao and Hong Kong. A sharing session was organized for students from Macao and Hong Kong to hear the voices of beneficiaries of project learning.

3. ACEI-HKM book publication: A book has been published

A book has been published in early 2008 with editors Lo, Y.C. & Yung, M.S. (Eds.) (2008) School Curriculum Reforms and Teachers' Professional Development: Cases in Mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau. Hong Kong: ACEI-HKM.

4. ACEI-HKM Website Renewal, July 2008 (website: www.acei-hkm.org.hk)
The website is periodically updated to include new development of the branch.

5. ACEI-HKM Branch meetings and Annual General Meetings

An Annual General Meeting was convened on 8 September 2007 for the election of officials for the new session 2007-2009. All Executive Meetings were held and completed as scheduled.

6. Visit of Professor Karen Liu, ACEI President, to Hong Kong Branch

The branch hosted a dinner sharing session with Professor Liu when she was on academic visit to Hong Kong on November 2, 2007. Karen appreciated the achievements attained by our branch, and suggested us to identify the niche of our ACEI branch and contribute to the welfare and education of students. Karen was invited to present Certificates of Award to Executive Board members of previous session (2005-2007) for their contributions and services to the ACEI-HKM.

The sharing session began at 6:00 and finished at 7:30pm. Dinner began right after the sharing and finished at 9:00pm. Karen served as an external examiner of the Hong Kong Institute of Education and visited the Institute as part of her service duty in November 2007. Our Association took this opportunity to invite her to address the Hong Kong and Macau branch on 2 November 2008.

We presented a paper describing the activities of ACEI-HKM and its future beyond 2007 for her reference. Karen appreciated the achievement of the branch and went on to describe her vision. She is the non-American ethnic background elected to be the President of the American based organisation ACEI since its establishment in 1892. She told the meeting that Shanghai had already set up a branch, while Beijing and Hangzhau were in the progress of setting up their branches. As far as she knows, branches in Asia include Hong Kong and Macau (HK&M), Taiwan, Shanghai, and Philippines. There is no branch in Japan, Korea so far. She would like to

establish a hub involving Taiwan, Shanghai, HK&M to hold a joint international conference in near future. The coming international conference would be in Moscow in 2008, and the next would be in 2011. ACEI-HQ will provide a seed money of USD3000 for the initial expenditure such as mail expense, travelling cost and other necessary expenditure for a branch engaged to organise international conference.

Karen reminded us to find the niche of the ACEI. ACEI is serving childhood focussing on children from age zero to middle childhood (grade 9), and early adolescents. At present, she is also an international committee member of OMEP. She distinguished ACEI from OMEP in that OMEP is an elite group of pre-school educators. OMEP was established in 1946 from elite pre-school educators.

Karen annotated that ACEI has quality guidelines for pre-school education. The guidelines have been translated into different languages including traditional and simplified Chinese. She suggested that we can use the guidelines to conduct research and collect data for reliability and validity studies. The findings can be presented in ACEI conferences for scholar exchange. The sharing was very fruitful and was conducted in a friendly and professional manner.

At the end of the sharing, Karen was asked to present Certificates of Award to Executive Board members of previous session (2005-2007) for their contribution and services to the ACEI-HKM. An honour plate for Ramsey Koo, our past and founding President who served the ACEI-HKM for eight years, was presented to him and Ben Choi received the plate on Ramey's behalf. Dinner began at 7:30pm with Hazel Lam of OMEP Hong Kong committee joined in.

2008年澳門教育現況與會務報告

澳門特區政府自從 2006 年 12 月通過了第 9/2006 號非高等教育綱要法後,政府及民間教育機構共同關 注新修訂的教育法的改革與執行。就中小幼學校的課程改革方面,澳門特區政府在教育暨青年局的編制內 重新設立課程工作小組,組織本地的教育學者及前線教師編寫不同教育階段各科的學力要求,並成立中港 台澳的課程專家顧問團,增加課程編寫的水平。在特殊教育方面,在 2006/2007 學年推行普通學校開設融 合班資助計劃,把融合教育推展到私立學校,鼓勵全澳門的學校與官立學校一起承擔特殊教育的工作,在 澳門的社會中推動融合教育的理念,使更多有特殊需要的學生獲得更有效和優質的教育。在 2007/2008 學 年初,公私立學校收錄的融合生數字分別爲 181 與 91,比率爲 2:1,發展頗急促。

除了進一步落實 15 年免費教育,促進幼兒教育和高中教育的發展外,教育發展基金的設立,爲所有 學校提供資助,讓其制定較長期的學校發展規劃,提升教育服務的質量。澳門特區政府又加強了教師專業 發展的資助,設立「脫產培訓」的資助規劃,讓教師專心到外地升讀教育專業培訓課程,提升教師的專業, 配合校本的發展。政府在大量使用公幣支持私立學校的運作與改革,自然引至學校教育質效評鑑的 Accountability 事宜,以向社會大眾及各教育持份者交待公共教育開支的成效及提升教育改革的方向,因此 教學督導的工作越來越繁重及多元,學校當局已與教育暨青年局的學校督導建立互信互動的關係,開展一 系列的學校評鑑的工作,找出各學校的強與弱,進一步提升澳門的教育質量。此外,澳門特區政府回應 社會人士及教育界的要求,成立「德育中心」,統籌品德教育,讓學生厚德盡善,成爲愛國愛澳的良好公 民。德育中心現正編寫品德教育政策指引文件及出版教材,培訓教師全面開展品德教育。

本會自成立後一直關注澳門教育改革。如在二十世紀末的小學課程檢討工作,對二十一世紀新教育法 草稿的意見書等,都顯示了本會透過不同形式爲澳門教育改革提供一定的助力。2008年本會更參與了學校 校本教師培訓的工作,直接協助前線的教師提升其專業。本會兩位執委會成員於2008年6月和7月間, 先後爲澳門中德學校、氹仔坊眾學校和澳門坊眾學校三所學校提供「小學數學教學教師校本培訓」講座, 爲 60 多位小學教師講解澳門小學生常犯的數學錯誤與錯誤概念,及如何有效教授學生計算文字題與解難。 雖然講座的時數只有短短的六小時,但是學校領導和教師對上述的課題與內容深感興趣,期望本會給予更 多的指導。2008年8月的執委會中,通過成立澳門學校校本培訓的工作小組以開發爲澳門學校提供校本教 師專業培訓與學校發展計劃,進一步投入澳門教育改革,推廣會務及服務社會。

Title: Education Policy, Reform, and School Innovations in the Asia-Pacific Region

Editors: Ramsey D. Koo (Past President, ACEI-HKM), Ben Cheong Choi (HKIEd), Maria Rita D. Lucas (Past President, ACEI-Philippines), & Tak Cheung Chan (Professor, Kennesaw State University, USA)

ACEI-HKM will publish a new book entitled *Education Policy, Reform, and School Innovations in the Asia-Pacific Region* (Editors: Ramsey Koo, Ben Choi, Maria Lucas, & TC Chan) by the end of fall 2008. The Asia-Pacific region, consisting nearly half the total human population and heterogeneity of people, nations and communities from Asia, North America and Oceania, is recognized as the world's fastest-growing region in global economy and education. Over the past decade, many countries and territories in the region have been excited by the promising and diversified opportunities for economic growth, socio-cultural development, and technological advancement. In recent years, in order to meet the needs and challenges of globalization, life-long learning, and a sustainable future for development, tremendous amount of resources and efforts in educational reform and school innovation at various levels have been initiated in both the public and private sectors. Nonetheless, educational change, reform, and innovation may have different meanings, tensions, effects, and implications to different countries, societies, and groups of people in the region.

This book will focus on educational change, policy reform, and school innovations in the Asia-Pacific region and examine some relevant issues, debates, theoretical and practical applications arising from the process and outcomes of education planning, reform, and school innovations, including different approaches, strategies, formulations and implementations, as well as the impact and challenges for continuity and changes within the educational system and society at large. The 30 articles contributed by a variety of educators, researchers, and school administrators are from countries and regions of the Asia-Pacific rim, including Guam, Oceania, and the USA. A total of seven chapters in Section I deal with review of major problems and challenges in educational policy, planning, and reform confronted by some countries in the Asia-Pacific. Section II which includes eight chapters examines innovations in teaching and learning and provides some cases of effective educational practices in the classroom and examples for program design and evaluation purpose. The integration of educational practices linking school, university, and the community, is also expounded.

Section III comprising five chapters focuses on language education and related issues in the Asia-Pacific at various grade levels including pre-school children. The use of English immersion and teacher evaluation and feedback approaches are also explored. The five chapters in

Section IV deal with educational technology and multimedia, including development of educational technology in China, sociological context for computers in India, and using Moodle to support on-line learning in university courses in the Philippines and USA. Section V comprising five chapters provides insights into teacher education and professional growth. Authors from various countries present ideas on changing teacher images and explore aspects of effective professional development in the larger context of teacher education and critically examine the process by which reform and innovation will result in highly qualified teachers capable of improving the teaching and learning environment as well as reflecting on a new vision of educational change and professional growth.

The intended audience of this book includes teachers, school administrators and counselors, university students and faculty staff, government policy planners, as well as researchers and practitioners associated with comparative social policies and school reform, curriculum and instruction, language and cultural studies, and socio-political issues in education. Copies of this book will be sent to academic institutions, government departments, education organizations, public and private libraries, etc. in many countries and regions across the continents.

珠三角地區教育的交流計劃(三): 專題研習(研究性學習)的實踐與分享的簡介

隨著內地經濟的發展和與港澳地區的融合,珠三角地區的聯繫和交流變得更爲緊密。港澳兒童國際教育協會於04年得到學科團體計劃撥款支持,舉辦了「珠三角地區兒童教育發展與交流」計劃,而於06-07年度本會又舉辦「珠三角地區的交流與分享」計劃。爲了繼續推動珠三角的教育交流,本會以「專題研習(研究性學習)的實踐與分享」爲題,舉辦第三期"珠三角地區教育交流計劃",有關計劃亦已獲香港教師中心撥款批准。期透過這個計劃的推行能促進區內的教育交流,讓區內教育工作者來港分享在專題研習(研究性學習)的最新教學經驗,在相互學習和擴闊彼此間視野的過程中,了解各地在專題研習或研究性學習的教學經驗;並在比較和分析後,按當地社會的需要來促進課堂教學的發展。計劃內容如下:

韶關教育交流團

參觀韶關市第一中學

韶關一中是廣東省重點中學,於零一年便在高一級開始執行《高中研究性學習課程實施方案》,零四年便全面實施新課程有關研究性學習活動的要求。

參觀廣東北江中學

廣東北江中學除了重視學生的學業成績外,亦鼓勵學生參加信息學奧林匹克類競賽和機器人競賽。在 研究性學習方面,該校教導處每年都會把學生最優秀的研究性學習報告編成一本案例集,從這些優秀案例 中可看到學生選題的多元性和學習的認真程度。該校還每年舉辦校內分享會讓準備開展研究性學習的高一學生,了解到高二學長的學習成果和經歷;過程中讓學生分享專題研習的做法,值得本港學校作參考。



學校課程改革與教師專業發展

中國內地、香港與澳門的經驗分享

第一本同時涉及中國內地、香港和澳門學校課程改革及教師專業發展的論文集

主編:羅耀珍博士 容萬城博士

學校課程改革與教師專業發展是廿一世紀教育界極度關注的議題,也是近年亞洲區域推行教育改革的重點。本書共輯錄八篇文章,以「學校課程改革與教師專業發展」爲主題,探討的背景是泛珠三角地區,包括中國內地、香港和澳門。本論文集致力於爲三地從事課程改革工作的教師提供有用的經驗,爲教育策劃者提供寶貴的參考資料。



編者編纂這本文集有以下三個主要的原因。第一,中國大陸、澳門和香港三地正積極推行教育改革,其焦點在改變學校課程發展模式,這本論文集能對三地所實行的課程改革政策與實踐作出有效的見證。第二,三地地理上互相接近,生活模式也相似,港澳主權回歸後,三地關係日益密切,交流漸見頻繁,發起編纂這本論文集,是爲著達到促進三地在教育上互相交流和學習的使命。第三,學校的課程改革與教師的專業發展是所有教師培訓課程的必修課題;現有文獻多以西方國家或單一的亞洲地方作爲討論背景,這本論文集填補這個空隙,是第一本同時涉及三地的學校課程改革與及教師的專業發展的專著。

論文探討的課題分爲兩部分:第一至五章有關學校的課程改革;單文經教授和林發欽先生在第一章分享了在澳門一所中學運用專題研習作爲歷史科教學策略的實作經驗;第二章裏,容萬城博士與何顯睿先生分析香港高級補充程度通識教育科的特色與實施時的情況,幫助教師進一步瞭解「新高中通識教育科」課程的推行。第三章是古瑛若與張淑賢兩位博士對中國大陸小學教育施行口語評估的研究,研究結果說明口語評估對教與學有重要的影響;第四章,Prof Keith Morrison 與鄧歡喜博士運用三個個案研究分析澳門學校現行的評估實況,讓讀者認識在澳門推行評估改革所須面對的挑戰;在第五章,李金潤先生與高國威博士探討在香港中學推行校本評估的實況,點明中文科校本評估的挑戰。第六至八章是有關教師在改革中的專業發展;在第六章,胡少偉博士比較香港和深圳兩地四個學校個案研究,說明課程改革中校本教師培訓的成功特徵;於第七章,黃素君博士評論澳門教師在課程改革中扮演的角色;第八章,羅耀珍博士對香港小學的課程領導作了初步的探究,幫助教師認識從事課程改革的課程領導的角色、所遇到的困難和問題和解決方法。

本書輯錄的文章理論與實踐兼備,經過嚴謹的評核步驟,受到港澳兒童教育協會的監察,致力於促進 泛珠三角地區教育交流,向三地從事課程領導的教師和決策者提供有力的支持。

《幼兒教育選集》之引介

在香港教育改革政策下,幼兒教育日益受到重視。爲確保幼兒教育質素,政府在政策上、課程上、培訓上都實施不同的措施,幼教工作者對各項措施都有不同的回響。一群香港教育學院幼兒教育課程的學生就教育改革進行探討、分析和回應。有關導師對同學的探究精神十分欣賞,並認爲他們的著作極有分享和參考價值,希望他們的聲音能與業界同工交流,幼兒教育的發展能喚起各界的關注和支持。
